    - OMB and GSA have directed the creation of the QSMO for selected mission support functions with release of OMB Memo M-19-16 Centralized Mission Support Capabilities for the Federal Government.



# **Unique Entity Identifier**

The Unique Entity ID (UEI) will be a new data element assigned by SAM.gov. It will be stored as a twelve (12) character, alpha-numeric value within databases as opposed to the current nine (9) digit DUNS.

Grant Reporting Efficiency and Agreements Transparency Act of 2019 Public Law No: 116-103

The GREAT Act requires OMB, jointly with the executive department that issues the most federal grant awards, to:

- Establish government-wide data standards for information reported by grant recipients.
- Issue guidance directing federal agencies to apply those standards.
- Require the publication of recipient-reported data collected from all agencies on a single public website.

## **GREAT Act**



### Key provisions:

- Enhances data quality with adoption of data standards.
- Improves accessibility to grantee audits.
- Promotes application of new technology to reporting.
- Establishes infrastructure foe publishing reports as open data.
- Mandates rapid implementation.
