



Purpose: Replace existing database with searchable dynamic database that readily adapts to emerging issues

Work to Date:

- Basic workflow and data collection (will include data definitions within system)
 - Funding Agency
 - Instrument Type
 - Specific Clause
 - Area of Concern
 - Reason of Concern
 - Negotiation Strategy
 - Outcome
 - Time for Entire Process



Next Steps: Work with developer and spec reporting requirements

- Non-FDP Clearinghouse participants (90+)
 - Ongoing Quarterly invitations based on interest since early 2021 ("Wait List Survey")
- Systems enhancements
 - Implemented Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
 - Removed Primary Auditee DUNS (when entity's Single Audit is part of a large comprehensive audit). DUNS=data universal numbering system thru Dun & Bradsteet

Exp Clearinghouse Collaborations

- FDP Infrastructure Committee Systems Working Group collaboration
 - Membership database coordination
- Collaboration with Subawards Subcommittee
 - Subrecipient Monitoring Working Group on financial risk assessment for non-Single Audit entities
 - Preparing institutional resources to internally communicate expectations relating to subrecipient relationships (e.g., Letter of Intent (LOI), subrecipient commitment forms, agreement terms)
- Membership Adherence Working Group collaboration



Expanded Clearinghouse Feedback

- Proposed new questions for audit findings related to research and Pass-Thru Entity (PTE) funding, and a requirement to list page numbers of findings
- Possible elimination of questions related to audit finding severity
- Use of institutional subrecipient commitment forms
- General feedback on the usefulness of the Expanded Clearinghouse for subrecipient risk assessment and audit review vs. other sources


