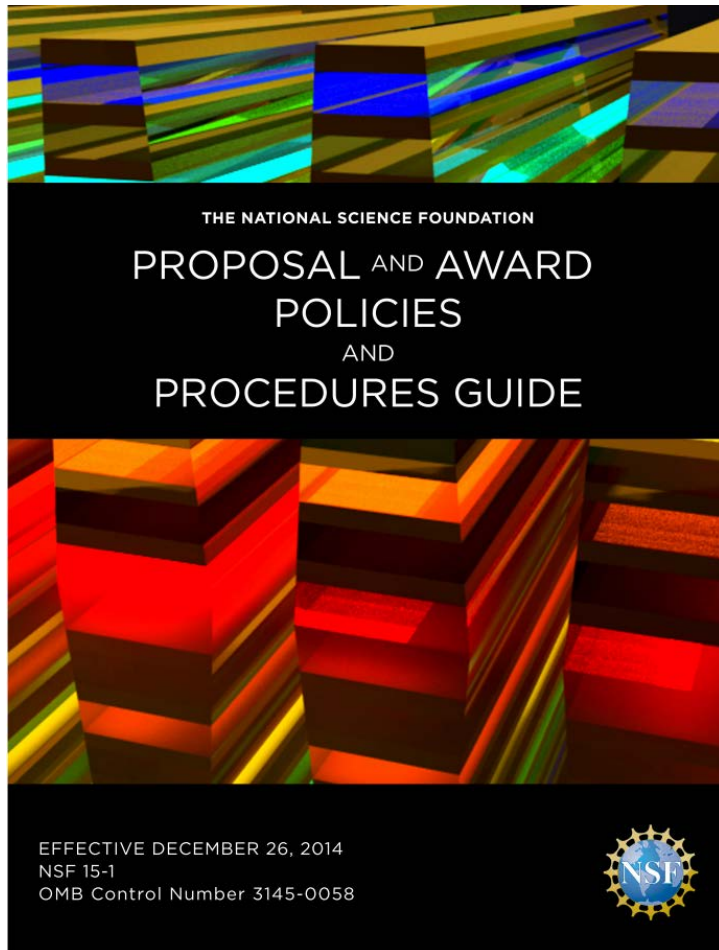

PAPPG – Non-Uniform Guidance Related Policy Revisions



- Effective for proposals submitted or due on or after December 26
- Effective for new awards and for funding amendments on existing awards made on or after December 26

PAPPG – Significant Changes Grant Proposal Guide (GPG)

- Special Exceptions to Deadline Date Policy – Inclement Weather
- Budget Justification
- Ideas Lab
- Clarification on two month salaries
- Format of the Proposal – Automated Compliance Checking

Automated Compliance Checking

- **GPG-specific auto-compliance checks, including Funding Mechanism/Proposal Section, anticipated January 26, 2015:**
 - Enforce page count rules for the following proposal sections:
 - Project Description
 - Budget Justification
 - Mentoring Plan
 - Data Management Plan
 - Budget Checks: implement duration and requested amount compliance checks
 - Example: maximum requested amount cannot exceed \$200,000 for a RAPID proposal
 - Enforce proposal sections depending on the funding mechanism type
 - Example: do not require References Cited for a Conference proposal

Upcoming IT Modernization Activities

- SciENCv Pilot (January/February)
 - Phase I of the Pilot beginning this month (Internal and with FDP volunteers) to evaluate user feedback and efficacy of the tool
 - Phase II planned for end of Q3 to assess submittal of tool-generated biosketches
- Notifications & Requests (March)
 - Begin migrating to Research.gov
 - 3 new requests: Salaries of Administrative or Clerical Staff; Travel Costs for Dependents; Inclusion of Funds Budgeted in “Other” Category of Participant Support Costs
- Proposal Compliance Validation (est. April)
 - Scope still TBD
 - Considering implementing some uniform solicitation rules
- ORCiD (est. April)
 - Allow Investigators to submit ORCiD ID as an optional field in their profile
